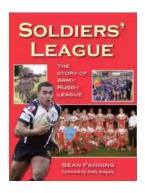
Sewing machines can do a wide range of things but usually we just don't realise how much.

But with a bit of knowledge, we can do so much more than just straight stitching.


Apart from an old fashioned straight-stitch-only machine, all other models will offer a number of different stitches, often using special presser feet.

A new sewing machine will come with an instruction book showing a selection of stitches, along with several different presser feet.




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
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
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
