## Elements of the Nursing Process

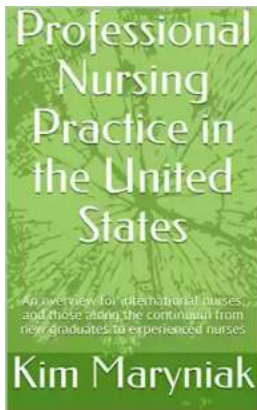
- ~ *Assessment* of healthcare needs, nursing diagnosis, planning, implementation, & nursing evaluation;
