experiences with the physical elements of the park and the culture and atmosphere surrounding the happiest place in Hong Kong, too."




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
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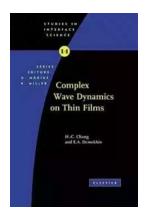
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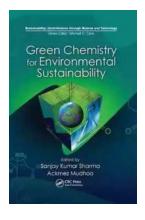
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
