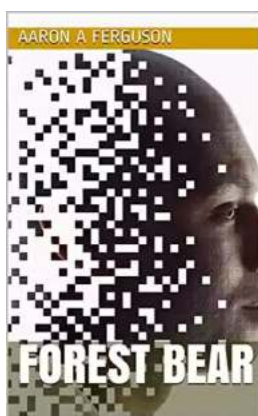

- Do you dare to "sponge"?

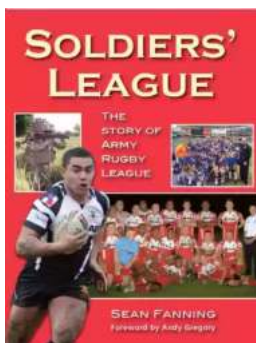
