- 3 Tablespoons Vegetable Oil
- 1-2 Drops Food Colouring
- Dried Flowers or petals (Optional)
- Glass bowl
- Muddler or whisk
- Jar with lid
- Mould



What to do:

Place dry ingredients in a large glass bowl pound or whisk out all the lumps.

Combine all wet ingredients together by pouring then into the jar and shaking.

Very slowly add the liquid ingredients to the dry. If you see foam you are pouring too fast.

Press mixture into the mould. Ensure it is tightly compressed.

Leave in mould for around 5 minutes before you remove it.

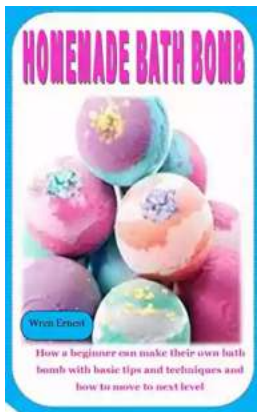
Makes around 4 large bombs.

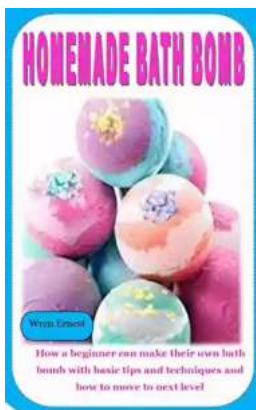

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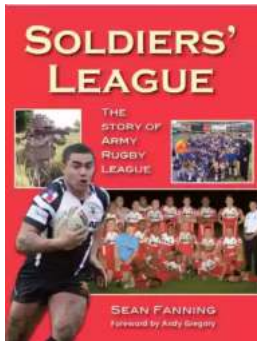
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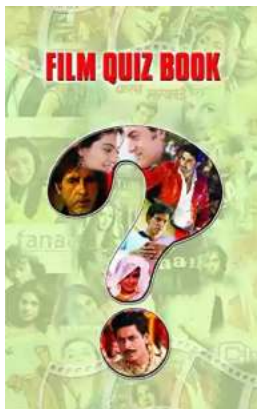
