The book explores the possible identity of the mysterious "Agent 355" mentioned in a cryptic Culper Ring message.



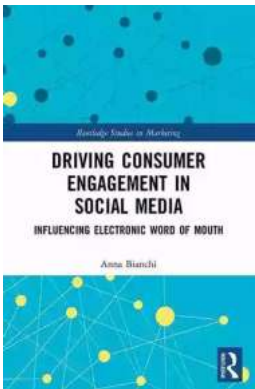
