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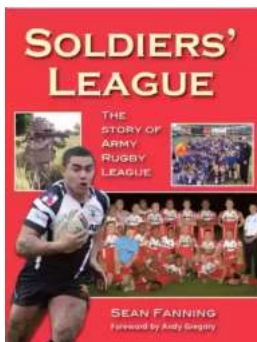
At a glance, this may look like a book about learning to count. It is that, and SO much more! Phonemic awareness is one indicator of how well a child will learn to

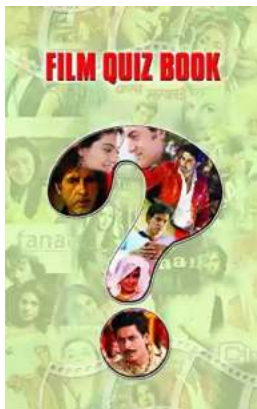
