accomplishments were too grand, their interests too varied, to be encompassed in a single phrase.

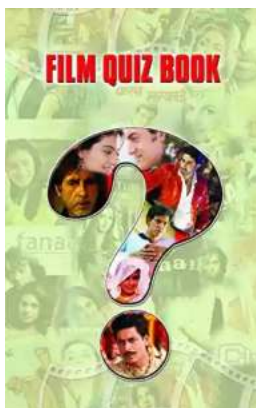
