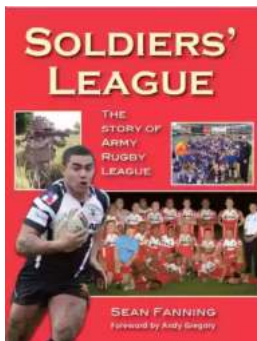

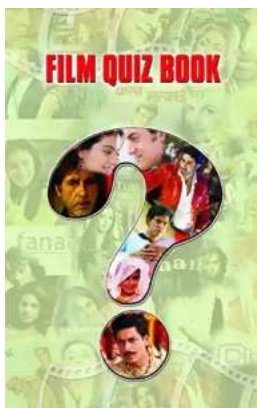
upbraided by a humble swineherd's wife, many of us are unaware that there even was a Battle of Ethandun.

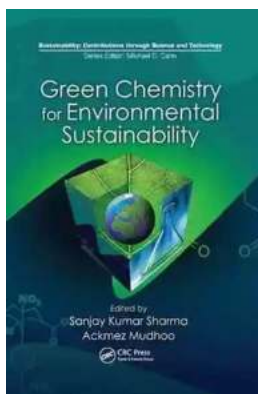
